FREE Gold Points Monster Knockout -June 24-25, Nashua, NH

There will be no entry fee to play in the Monster Knockout in Nashua. Play for free as long as you keep winning (for details see the flyer on New England or ACBL websites) This is a great opportunity to try out this exciting team event and win piles and piles of gold points. The format for a knockout is simple. A match usually consists of 24 boards per session. In a head-to-head match the winner advances, and the loser is out. Three-way matches usually consist of two sets of twelve boards. Two of the three teams advance; only one is eliminated. A knockout event lasts until only one team remains.

Because this is a bracketed event your opponents will, to the extent possible,

have total masterpoints that are in the same range as your team.

The Monster KO is scheduled for Saturday (2 sessions) and Sunday (2 sessions). Gold points are awarded to all members of teams that survive two sessions, making this the TRUE Gold Rush for All.



Cue Bidding

There are many uses of cue bids, the most common being to show a limit raise or better of partner's suit, after the opponents have bid some other suit, OR, asking partner to bid no trump, if he/she has a stopper in the opponents' suit.

EX: N E S W	EX: N E S W
1D 1H P 2D*	1H 2D 2H 3H*
*Limit raise or better of hearts	* if you have a heart stopper, partner, bid 3NT. Implicitly, W has (a) nice diamond support and (b) at least an opening bid to be interested in game.

Here is a hand that was played a couple of times before the last Sectional.

At both tables, this was the auction, and South lost one trick in each suit for plus 110. Neither North thought to Cue Bid spades at his first turn. If so,

* either a Limit+ raise of D or asking for NT

When South bids 2NT, showing a spade stopper and a minimum overcall, North goes to 3NT. The opening lead is the spade 8, and the key play is to duck this, and win the continuation. This way, when South forces out the ace of diamonds, West has no spade to return, and South wins the ace of clubs, knocks out the ace of hearts, and loses the same tricks, one in each suit. I think we all agree that if we're going to lose a trick in each suit, we would rather be in 3NT than 3 diamonds.
