Call to Order: Marshall called the meeting to order at 10: 17

In/Out report

Old Business:

Nationals in Providence Great news that the NABC has been rescheduled to Providence for 2022. Initially the 2021 in Providence was cancelled. Fortunately for us, the NABC in Washington for 2022 was cancelled due to

the hotel in Washington having gone out of business. Providence was able to accommodate the desired dates for 2023. The official dates have not been announced at this time. The NABC committee is still in place and all participants are still involved.

March Tournament and Subsequent Tournaments

Peter Marcus has told Maureen that we can have tournaments after August 1. We are not sure if the Senior Center would be willing to accommodate us. They are reticent. We would have to consider limiting the numbers, screening, only going with reservations. Marshall is leaning toward cancelling as we are not sure what restrictions will be in place. Barry suggested we ask about vaccinations. We are not sure if we can do that legally. Some discussion followed about Covid. Concern about variations from other states. Consensus that we hold off another month or two before we cancel the tournament. Questions about masks, distancing etc still in the air. A lot of work will have to happen prior to having the tournament. Sue said if we have to worry about all the protocols it might be better to have a tournament when we can run the tournaments the way we did before. Marshall asked Sue what directors would want to come and direct tournaments. The first tournament back has to be spectacular so that folks will come back.
